

ABOUT PORTO

Porto - Capital and gateway to the north of Portugal, Porto is both the city that provided a nation with a name and a fortified wine known world-wide: port.

With its splendid geographical location on the mouth of the river Douro and an architectural heritage of exceptional quality, the historic centre of Porto was declared UNESCO World Heritage in 1996. Porto is the capital of the North and the second largest city in the country; its hard-working inhabitants are noted for their commercial enterprise, always standing firm against outside impositions and foreign invaders, which explains why Porto has become known as the «unvanquished» city.

In addition to its history, any visitor to Porto will be quickly impressed by the forceful character both of the city and its inhabitants.

If you want to get to know the city better, we recommend a gentle stroll through its streets, taking time to admire the typical granite houses and monuments, enjoying a tram ride along the banks of the river, or even going for a boat ride under the city's six bridges, from where you can enjoy an entirely different view of the city. These itineraries seek to demonstrate the impressive contrasts this city has to offer. The "Baixa (Downtown)" of Porto, with all the rhythms of city life, its movement and intense retailing. There is a very peculiar expression which bestows a Nordic, mercantile tone onto a city that is both spiritually and intensely baroque. In sharp contrast, in the Serralves Park, there is the sheer modernity of the building housing the Museum of Contemporary Art, and the romantic, soothing surroundings of the surrounding leafy park.

TRAVEL TO PORTO

Getting Around

To get to and from the conference venue to other parts of town the most convenient way is by taxi. Downtown can be reached in a 5 to 10 minutes-trip. From downtown, then metro and bus are the best alternatives. A nice option to get around along the Douro river, including Ribeira, Foz do Douro and the neighbouring cities of Matosinhos and Gaia, is to rent a bike. Several rental shops can be found around the area of Ribeira.

Getting to Porto by plane

Porto is easily reachable by plane. Porto airport Francisco Sá Carneiro airport is a very well connected international airport with daily flights to the major European cities and a few intercontinental direct connections. Therefore, getting to Porto is generally at most a two hops flight.



Arrival Information

The Porto international airport is also known as Francisco Sá Carneiro Airport and was elected one of the five best European Airports. It is located about 10 km, a quick 20 minutes drive, from the Porto city centre where most of the hotels are located. The airport is served by Porto Metro. The service links the airport to Porto city centre. Public transport buses and dedicated shuttle buses also link the airport and the city.

Arriving at FAUP

The easiest way to get to the venue is by public transports or taxi.

• **By Public Transports (Metro)** Getting to the conference venue Porto airport by metro is convenient, fast and cheap – a 25 minute-trip every 1/2 hour from the airport to the main town.

The quickest and most efficient way to reach Porto's city centre from the airport is by metro - line E-Violet (Aeroporto – Trindade). This line operates daily from 06:00 - 01:00 and from here, getting to the city centre takes about 30 minutes. The Andante ticket (which has a price of 0.60) needed for this journey can be purchased at any of the automatic ticket machines in the Metro station – occasional ticket (Z4). It costs 2€, is valid for 1 hour and 15 minutes and is also rechargeable. Don't forget, one card per person. You can also buy your tickets at the airport tourism office (open everyday from 8 am to 7 pm).

To get to the city centre by bus, you can take either line 601, 602 or 3M (12:30am-5:30am). In this case, you can buy a single trip ticket on the bus, costing $2 \in$.

There are also Andante Tour tickets, **1 day** – **7**€ - and **3 days** – **15**€. This ticket allows you unlimited travel on bus and metro.

• By taxi or UBER-like services

The city is served by 700 taxis. Taxis generally take about 25 minutes. A taxi from the airport directly to Porto School of Architecture costs around 20 – 30€.

• By Car:

Porto has a privileged geographic location, complemented by a modern communications network. It's easy for anyone coming from Galicia, the Algarve, Lisbon, Coimbra or from any other point in the country to arrive comfortably to the city and equally as easy to travel to any of these destinations.

Throughout Porto there are various public and private car parks at your disposal.

Besides national roads (EN, IC, IP), free, the city has access to various highways, subject to toll: A1 Lisbon, linking to the Algarve; A3 Valença (Minho), linking to Galicia; A4 Amarante (Trás-os-Montes), linking to Bragança; A28 (Porto - Cerveira) and A29 (Porto - Aveiro/Cantanhede). Some of these highways are to be paid at the end of the trip with the ticket that must be collected at the beginning of the highway. The ways showing the sign "Via Verde" are for monthly-pass holders only.



• By National and International road passenger transport:

You can travel to or from Porto with ease from any point in Portugal or Europe. In doing so, you have a number of road transport services which offer regular city links.

From the international transport terminal you are provided with the following options when travelling to the city centre:

• Casa da Música interface

- Metro: lines A Blue (Estádio do Dragão Senhor de Matosinhos), B Red (Estádio do Dragão Póvoa de Varzim), C – Green (Campanhã / ISMAI), E – Violet (Estádio do Dragão - Aeroporto) and F – Orange (Fânzeres/Senhora da Hora).
- The Andante ticket needed for this journey can be purchased at any of the automatic ticket machines in the Metro stations, occasional ticket (Z2). It costs 1.85€, is valid for 1 hour, and is rechargeable.
- Bus lines 501, 502 and 201 are also available and taxis.

• By Train

Porto is served by international trains, Alfa Pendular (high-speed train), intercity, inter-regional, regional and urban trains, connecting the city to several destinations inside and outside the country.

The Campanhã train station is the busiest in the city and the S. Bento railway station is the most central one.

CP's urban trains allows you to travel to nearby towns, such as Vila Nova de Gaia, Espinho, Guimarães, Braga, Viana do Castelo and Aveiro. Train tickets must be purchased before your journey, from sales points or automatic ticket machines.
