Our 2024-26 Triennial Action Plan action continues active initiatives from 2021-23 as well as including new initiatives, in response to our memberships' interests.



International Scientific Committee on 20th Century Heritage Triennial Action Plan 2024-2026



Initiative Name: Sustainability, climate change & emergency response

Initiative Summary

Climate change was a priority project for the ICOMOS 2020-23 triennial plan and emergency response is the focus of the 2023-6 triennial plan. Building on the ISC20C 2023 seminar in Sydney (https://vimeo.com/event/3634925/0d4932a6f3) this initiative aims to identify issues and responses/actions specifically relating to 20th Century heritage that continue the work of the last triennial on climate change and also incorporate related topic of emergency response. The first area will review the ICOMOS glossary for climate change and incorporate any additional terms needed to address 20th Century heritage. Using case studies, the second area of work will start collecting and categorizing 20th Century building typologies, in order to examine where there may be benefit to examining questions of life cycle assessment, mitigation or adaptation using such categories.

Three-year goals for initiative:

- 1. Establish and present a a list of case studies based on adopted criteria, commence analysis of a few (depending on resources available) alongside a glossary to enhance climate literacy across membership
- 2. Facilitating 6 working group meetings/year. The meetings will be open to all ISC20C members
- 3. Determine a priority list of potential research or actions that can be advanced by the committee in the future

2024 Goals for Initiative:

- 1. Establish a working team of bureau members, expert members, and EPs
- 2. Survey membership to establish the level of knowledge, existing initiatives by members, and identify potential case studies
- 3. Develop a thematic glossary of terms (using the current CCAWG glossary as a base) concerning climate change of relevance to 20th Century heritage to enhance common understanding and climate change literacy across our membership
- 4. Develop a short overview of 20th Century Building typologies, according to energy use and embodied carbon, an explanation of the methodology used and background literature on the various typologies
- 5. Begin to compile a list of cases studies from projects that demonstrate a range of responses to climate change mitigation and adaptation for 20th Century places
- 6. Develop a suitable template for facilitating the above-mentioned analytical studies

- 1. Identify and co-opt isc20c members as working group members
- 2. Attend regular bi-monthly online working meetings with specific agenda
- 3. Contribute to the research work for the project

Opportunities for EPs engagement with the Initiative:

- 1. Assist working group to identify and develop case studies in consultation with expert members
- 2. Assist working group to develop database template
- 3. Assist Principal and Co-Investigators to compile short summaries of submitted responses from questionnaire
- 4. Assist PI and CIs to compile and organize bibliography thematically

Triennial Action Plan 2024-2026



Initiative Name: Twentieth Century Heritage Practice Survey 2024

Initiative Summary

The Twentieth Century Heritage Practice Survey 2024 will assess the national state of conservation and protection of Twentieth Century heritage places, with a view to identifying practice needs and capacity building projects and priorities. National Committees will be asked to complete a short survey to identify the current state of conservation for modern heritage, and to identify emerging issues. Case studies are also invited. ISC20C members will be available to assist National Committees in completing the survey and an ISC20C Working Group will analyse the results and changes since the initial 2001 survey (MAP20). Findings will be E published on the ISc20C website and potential projects and priorities identified for consideration in future ISC20C Triennial Action Plans. Scope

- 1. Re-establish Working Group, review revised survey design and action plan, meet regularly
- 2. Surveys issued to National Committees, support/interviews of NC presidents by ISC20C members
- 3. Analysis (preliminary report to AGM in August, AdCom November 2024)
- 4. Final Report development for E publication on website and recommendations for ISC20C action 2025

Three-year goals for initiative:

- 1. Complete survey and analysis Dec 2024
- 2. Ready for E publication. Jan/Feb 2025; Upload to ISC20C website Feb/March 2025
- 3. Recommendations for action to ISC20C bureau; preliminary August 2024 and final February 2025

2024 Goals for Initiative:

- 1. Survey revised and interviews completed July 2024
- 2. Results assessed and preliminary findings shared at ISC20C AGM August 2024
- 3. 2025 report finalized and made accessible to members and respondants

- 2. Assist/interview National Committees to complete the survey and case studies

The survey will identify capacity building projects and practice/information needs such as where local inventories are needed for modern heritage to be prepared and equipped for dealing with emergency response and recovery.



Initiative Name: The Twentieth Century Historic Thematic Framework

Initiative Summary

This ambitious project aims to develop and disseminate an historic thematic framework that can be utilized for the identification and the development of inventories for 20th Century heritage and comparative analysis exercises. The Twentieth Century Historic Thematic Framework was produced by the ISC20 in collaboration with the Getty Conservation Institute in 2022 in English, French and Spanish and is now on the ISC20 website. An Arabic version is pending. To disseminate the HTF, 3 regional seminars were held introducing the HTF (Middle East, Africa and Europe) in 2022 and an additional 3 European webinars on specific themes and subthemes were held in 2023. Additional regional seminars are planned for 2024 along with other tools to help users.

Three-year goals for initiative:

- 1. Promulgate widely the HTF as an essential tool for identifying 20th Century heritage places
- 2. Develop a short info guide on using the HTF with case study examples and make short videos as part of the ISC20's Education Initiative
- 3. Identify case studies of use of the HTF for inclusion of the website
- 4. Complete regional seminars on the HTF

2024 Goals for Initiative:

- 1. Develop and deliver a minimum of 2 regional seminars of the HTF in SE Asia and in South America by the end of 2024
- 2. Make all seminars available on the website
- 3. Identify how HTF is being used by the Twentieth Century Heritage Practice Survey 2024 to assist in developing further targeted dissemination efforts

Opportunities for Member engagement with the Initiative:

- 1. Engage with/organize regional and national dissemination events
- 2. Actively promote use of HTF in research and inventory work
- 3. Identify examples of uses of HTF as case studies for the website

Opportunities for EPs engagement with the Initiative:

- 2. Work with project leads to produce short guides and case studies for website and videos

- 1. Good emergency response relies on existing inventories of heritage places which provide a basis for identifying heritage places in the aftermath of disaster and prioritizing specific actions
- Inventories are a fundamental tool and ISC20 has prioritized encouraging, supporting, and providing tools for counties and authorities to develop inventories for 20th Century places

Initiative Name: Education and Training

Initiative Summary

This project initiative aims to advance opportunities for learning through the development of learning materials based on past and current committee initiatives.

The project aims to collaborate with other subcommittees to prioritize opportunities for learning materials that would consist of key subject areas to be identified and by gathering knowledge and experience from the ISC20C members across its membership, other ISCs and professional affiliates.

This project will also further coordinate with the ICOMOS University Forum as well as the ICOMOS CIF; work will aim to better understand how the ISC20C should interact or align with both of these committees including affiliate cultural institutions.

The aim of the learning materials will be based on the developed work of the committee- formats could include short videos, topic discussions, possible interviews, and eventually roundtable discussions. These could also expand on informative short soundbites of information made available on the ISC20C website. Learning materials could be disseminated through the creation of a YouTube channel.

Three-year goals for initiative:

- 1. Develop a one-page prospectus that describes the aims and objectives for this training initiative
- 2. Brainstorm and identify topics based on current committee initiatives that could be developed by volunteer committee members and Emerging Professionals
- 3. Liaison with the ICOMOS University Forum as well as the ICOMOS CIF; develop monitoring and more communication between the ISC20C and these committees. Collaborate, establish points of contact and attend meetings with both committees
- 4. Identify one of two topics for development into short, recorded talks, webinars, interview or panel discussions (e.g. could partner with Heritage Alerts or the Care Project Survey Initiative). For example, detailed explanation on each initiative program could be explained including their importance as a means of training opportunity of the ISC20C
- 5. Topics could be case studies that illustrate the aims and objectives outlined in the prospectus

2024 Goals for Initiative:

- 1. January April 2024
 - Develop One Page Prospectus about the aims and objectives of the committee and its objectives
- 2. May August 2024
 - a. Brainstorm and identify topics, recorded talks, webinars and discussion that could be considered, developed and edited by the committee
 - b. Identify one or two topics for development into a short talk, panel talk, interview or discussion, should be based on work of the ISC20C. e.g. could include specific profiles developed from MAP20, HTF, Madrid New Delhi Document or Heritage Alerts
- 3. September through December 2024
 - a. Develop one topic (short 6-minute topic) to be hosted on select media channels (e.g. ISC20C Youtube channel). Could be used as a model topic for generating the next topic
 - b. Create a Youtube or other broadcast channels (e.g. Vimeo)
 - c. Link first developed topic to the ISC20C website and other searchable social media platforms



Opportunities for Member engagement with the Initiative:

- 1. Engage with/organize opportunities for further dissemination of information from the ISC20C that advances? the work of the committee
- 2. Actively promote current initiatives of the committee to solicit more volunteers towards the work of the ISC20C
- 3. Identify examples of training opportunities to be linked to the ISC20C website to generate more engagement across online platforms for continued learning and information dissemination

Opportunities for EPs engagement with the Initiative:

- 1. Eps are instrumental in organizing and running social media and website platforms; we need support and broadcast the continued learning through training and information dissemination in 2024 and throughout the next Triennium
- 2. Work with project leads for each initiative to brainstorm the first topics to be developed as a means of model topics to be used in the future

Initiative Summary

The formation of the ISC20C Emerging Professionals group follows the Resolution 19GA 2017/33, consisting of recommendations passed by the ICOMOS General Assembly on the formation of an international Emerging Professionals Working Group. The ISC20C Emerging Professionals group is a subset of the larger Emerging Professional Working Group [EPWG]1 and was formed in 2020 by the ISC20C Bureau under the bureau's Education Initiative. The goal of the mentorship program is to establish a meaningful relationship between an EP and bureau or initiative leader that will promote the growth of the EPs heritage conservation career. The aim of the group is also to provide networking opportunities with other new members and offer the benefit of education and mentorship from experts in the heritage conservation field of 20th-century heritage. Initiative Name: National Scientific Committees (NSC)

Initiative Summary

The strengthening of national scientific committees for the preservation of 20th-century heritage is an initiative aimed at gaining a better understanding of the activities underway the ICOMOS local level. There are already some national 20thC committees organized and working individually. This benefits other initiatives of the ISC20c as the NSC have the capacity for dialogue and access to local issues.

Therefore, the initiative aims, above all, to create a communication network that contributes to both local and international actions and aligns the local with the international committee work.

Three-year goals for initiative:

- 1. Finalizing of a protocol, that clarifies bylaws for subcommittees and aligns the local with the international committee work, based on the *Dubrovnik Valletta Principles for the ICOMOS National Committees* (link: https://www.icomos.org/images/DOCUMENTS/Dubrovnik-Valletta_Principles_EN_20091017.pdf)
- 2. Presentation of the protocol at the AGM 2026 for ICOMOS approval
- 3. To know the national scientific committees and their coordinators
- 4. Organize actions based on the Dubrovnik Valletta Principles for the ICOMOS National Committees
- 5. Conduct regular meetings for discussions and presentation of relevant cases
- 6. Encourage the participation of NSCs in other initiatives such as Dissonant Heritage and Heritage Alert, etc.

2024 Goals for Initiative:

- 1. Organize the network of committees (to be listed with links and contact points at the ISC20C website, yearly update by local committees)
- 2. Encourage the creation of new committees
- 3. Present possibilities for involvement in the ISC20c
- 4. Call for annual reports, that will be summarized and communicated to the bureau/ISC20C
- 5. Draft protocol, that clarifies bylaws for subcommittees and aligns the local with the international committee work

Initiative Summary

The aim of this initiative is to use the expertise of the members of the ISC20C to confirm the facts of the threat and the heritage significance of the property, then alert the public though the ICOMOS network and selectively act to support the conservation of the property at risk. ISC20C maintain a list of 20th Century Heritage Alerts and provide input to the ICOMOS Heritage at Risk Report.

Three-year goals for initiative:

- 1. Discuss and process any incoming request for Heritage Alert
- 2. Update map of 20c Heritage Alert Cases on the ISC20C website

2024 Goals for Initiative:

- 1. Finalize and post the protocol for ISC20C Heritage Alert-process (simplified)
- 2. Finalize and post a Request form for Heritage Alerts on the ISC20C website
- 3. Establish an internal draft guidance for how to establish international signficance/relevance of 20C Heritage
- 4. Eventually publish a map of 20c Heritage Alert Cases on the ISC20c website

Opportunities for Member engagement with the Initiative:

 Be part of the Advocacy sub-committee for one or more Heritage Alerts: as specified in the scope/mission, the expertise of the ICOMOS-ISC 20C members will be used to confirm the significance of and threats to a property indicated to be at risk, supporting the ISC20C Advocacy throughout all the Heritage Alert Process

Initiative Name: Dissonant Heritage

Initiative Summary

Dissonant heritage in relation to 20th century heritage has been an important theme for academics and ICOMOS in Europe for some years, mainly focused on war and the socialist – communist architecture. The aim of this new ISC20C initiative is to explore if and how the theme relates thematically and geographically to 20th Century Heritage more broadly and globally, identify the common conservation challenges and potentially exploring further initiatives/actions to address these challenges and engage the wider membership base.

Three-year goals for initiative:

- 1. 2025: 1-2 online workshops leading to the conference to begin to gauge interest, develop common themes and issues.
- 2. 2026: Conference
- 3. 2026: Position paper (outcome of the conference).

2024 Goals for Initiative:

- 1. August 2024: Building an international group of engaged ISC20C members (via email invitation and online meeting).
- 2. End of 2024/beginning of 2025: Debating the concept (online seminar/workshop) within the ISC20C group. Starting with J.E. Turnbridge and G.J. Ashworth's definition of dissonant heritage as the management of the controversial past (from "Dissonant Heritage," 1996), the debate aims to discuss how the concept evolves further. How is it related to HTF (for example theme 10: "War and its aftermath")? Is it connected to wider issues of the "planetary crisis"?
- 3. The aim of the workshop/seminar is to define particularly important aspects of dissonant heritage for ISC20C in the global sense and to work further on these issues. Suggested topics could include heritage of migrations/stateless heritage, with an initial case study of WWII refugees from Europe, others could include topics of relevance to the post-colonial, post-dictatorships, totalitarianism etc.

1. Engage in the working group to help identify commonality and scope a potential wider initiative.

Initiative Name: Socialist Heritage

Initiative Summary

The Platform Socialist Heritage was created as a regional, mainly Eastern Europe isc20c initiative in 2018. An outgrowth and closely aligned withthe European Dissonant Heritage work, the initiative addressed one of the most threatened types of dissonant heritage in Eastern and Central Europe Socialist Modernist Architecture. It advocated for socialist architecture and art to be recognized and protected as cultural landmarks and historic monuments. Through extensive photo documentation, books and presentations at seminars it has successfully made socialist architecture and art visible within ICOMOS.

The aim of the initiative is now to broaden the perspective and examine socialist heritage in other regions: Latin America, Africa as well as Asia, Central Asia. The platform intends to collect and provide information on location and site, current condition of conservation, the authors and the planning and building history of socialist legacy.

Three-year goals for Initiative:

- 1. Identification of valuable sites associated with Socialist Heritage in less researched areas such as Latin America, Asia, Africa, also includes Cuba, Cambodia, Vietnam, etc.
- 2. Organizing at least 1-2 online conferences/round tables dedicated to the research of the Socialist Heritage. The aim is to investigate the relevance of socialist heritage more broadly by identifying sites, and heritage programs to protect it internationally
- 3. Launch of 4 cultural projects which may include the promotion of the heritage specific to the 20c period in CCE, Latin America, Africa or other areas
- 4. Creation of an international working group to advance the initiative

2024 Goals for Initiative:

- 1. To create a simple list of all initiatives around the world associated with Socialist Heritage (name of initiatives, link to website or contact information). The initiative leader will keep the list up to date
- 2. Dissemination of the information on the ISC20C website or media channels
- 3. Impact analysis after information dissemination in the ISC20c network

1. Creation of a working group among ISC20c members interested in the subject of Socialist Heritage
